### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Deputy Minister of the Department of Justice

We have audited the accompanying statement of cash receipts and disbursements of the Maintenance Enforcement Program (MEP) Trust Account for the year ended March 31, 2013.
